Mt. Lebanon Cemetery Renovation Project...

During the February 10, 2019 meeting of the Church Council, members of the Mt. Lebanon Cemetery Renovation committee presented their plan for improving the cemetery. The goal of the committee is to improve the beauty of Mt. Lebanon Cemetery, bring out the natural beauty of the location and minimize maintenance.

Proposal: Improve the cemetery entrance and overall appearance by:

- Level, grade, and pave cemetery drive entrance.
- Add old style brick entry columns (with monumental Mt. Lebanon Cemetery marker) on both sides of the drive with wrought iron extensions and wrought iron gate.
- Install cemetery boundary markers at four corners.
- Request the power service to cell tower be rerouted underground to pole past cemetery area.
- Plant native trees (i.e. dogwood and redbud) along existing wood line.

The Mt. Lebanon Cemetery Renovation committee was given permission by Council's vote to pursue pricing for the proposed items. No action will be taken without council's or the congregation's approval. Any questions can be directed to Hank Rhame, Jim Gates or Pastor Eric Little.
